



CELEBRATE RECOVERY

The purpose of Celebrate Recovery is to fellowship and celebrate God's healing power in our lives through the Twelve Steps and Eight Recovery Principles. This experience allows us to "be changed." We open the door by sharing our experiences, strengths and hopes with one another. In addition, we become willing to accept God's grace in solving the problems in our lives.

By working and applying these Biblical principles, we begin to grow spiritually. We become free from our addictive, compulsive and dysfunctional behaviors. This freedom creates peace, serenity, joy and most importantly, a stronger personal relationship with God and others.

As we progress through the program we discover our personal, loving and forgiving Higher Power – Jesus Christ.

Celebrate Recovery meets every Saturday night, 52 weeks a year, even when Saturday falls on a holiday! You do not need to be a member of BHBC to attend.

6:30—7pm Arrive | Grab some coffee and a snack, reconnect with your CR friends and prepare your heart for God's healing touch for you.

7—8pm Large Group Session | We meet together for a time of worship then teaching or a testimony. There is no pre-registration or signup. Feel free to bring a friend or family member. Upon arrival you will be greeted by a greeter and handed a bulletin to help you become acclimated.

8—9pm Open Share Groups | This is the time to break into gender specific recovery groups. Meet others with similar hurts, habits and hang-ups.

8—9pm Newcomers Group | This is a *one time* meeting where you will learn more about Celebrate Recovery, hear personal mini-testimonies and ask direct questions. If you are new to CR or a visitor, we invite you to attend this meeting after the Large Group Session.

9—10:30pm Solid Rockin' Café | Held after Open Share Groups. This is a great time to fellowship with others from your group. Join us for refreshments and dessert.
